The Orlando City code requires you to pick up after your pet. It's a nuisance, and leads to water pollution no matter where you live. Please follow this link to learn the best ways to help protect our lakes:

The Orlando City code also prohibits the discharge of polluting matter like oak leaves and landscaping materials in natural waters. That helps to protect our lakes and minimize the cost of lake maintenance. Those materials get into our lakes when leaves and other materials get blown down stormwater drains. The rule is stormwater utility code section 31.19. Most landscaping companies try to follow the rules. However, there have been complaints about companies that do not do that. If you see a landscape company that refuses to follow the rules, you should call the Stormwater Department at 407-246-2370.
