Southwest Orlando Transportation Infrastructure Plan

Project Overview

The study area is located southwest of Downtown Orlando and contains one of the top visitor destination corridors in Florida. The area plays a key role in the region's economic health, and the City of Orlando recognizes the need to improve transportation access to the area as well as options for travel within the area, especially given future connections to SunRail (commuter rail) and high-speed rail.

This study, known as the Southwest Orlando Transportation Infrastructure Plan (SOTIP), focuses on the North International Drive area, which is located primarily within the City of Orlando, and surrounding neighborhoods. The study area is bounded by Sand Lake Road (to the south), Vineland Road (to the north), Turkey Lake Road and I-4 (to the west), and Tangelo Park and Festival Bay Mall (to the east). In this study, the City is developing overall transportation strategies that will improve mobility in the study area and will guide future transportation investment decisions.

The City is developing the SOTIP in concert with Orange County, LYNX, the Florida Department of Transportation, and area stakeholders.

Study Status

Data collection was completed in July 2010. Alternative strategies will be drafted, using the collected data and stakeholder input. These strategies will be detailed in an overall plan for the study area. This information will be shared with stakeholders and refined before presenting the SOTIP to the Orlando City Council in December 2010.
