

S. Howard Atha House

The Atha House, built 1928, is an excellent example of a private residence constructed in the Colonial Revival style which was popular in the United States from 1880 to 1955. Located in the historic College Park neighborhood, this two-story home features an irregular plan, hipped roof surfaced with composition shingles, wide roof eaves, wood frame structural system clad in aluminum siding and continuous brick foundation. The central two-story section of the house exhibits a symmetrical front façade with three bays, a corbelled brick chimney, a gabled dormer with Palladian window and dentils and a one-story flat roof partial-width entry portico with fluted Doric columns. It was built by prominent local contractor Howard Kiehl for S. Howard Atha, one of the founders of the Orlando real estate firm Cooper-Atha-Barr, also known as CABCO.
