Commissioner Lynum Promotes Broadband Adoption during Annual NOBEL Conference

ORLANDO, FL –The National Organization of Black Elected Legislative (NOBEL) Women held its annual conference from June 18-20 in Chicago, Illinois. Commissioner Daisy Lynum, President of the National Black Caucus of Local Elected Officials (NBC-LEO) met with over 250 other women elected officials, presidents and executives of organizations and corporations from across the country, to launch the African American Women Technology Caucus (AAWTC) during the conference.

The Caucus was created to ensure that policy development related to advanced communications technologies and broadband deployment has a strong focus on women and African American communities.

During the launch, Dr. Nicol Turner-Lee, Vice President of One Economy, premiered “Diary of a Single Mom” and discussed the importance of creating relevant public-purpose online media that encourages broadband policy deployment, adoption and usage applications in unserved and underserved communities.

NOBEL is a non-partisan, not-for profit organization primarily comprised of current and former Black women legislators as well as many appointed officials. Originally created in 1985 to increase and promote the presence of Black women in government, NOBEL has expanded its vision to address a myriad of Zissues of all women.
