**Meeting Notes**  
**Wednesday, February 18, 2004**

The meeting of the Mayor's Parramore Task Force Social Services/Educational Subcommittee Task Team #1 on Parramore Residents' Social Services Needs met on Wednesday, February 18, 2004 at 4:00 p.m. at the Dr. J. **The notes from the February 11, 2004 task team meeting were reviewed.**

**Socioeconomic data** on the Parramore area was updated from the 2000 Census and distributed. The spreadsheet will be edited to compare 1990 data with the 2000 data. It was approximated that at least one half of the Parramore area qualifies for some type of social service need. The criteria for a resident to qualify for a social service will be necessary to identify the quantity of needs for the area. Hudie is in the process of getting this information from 2-1-1 and Tim Adams will check with Workforce on their data. In order to have housing information on the Parramore area population since 2000, it will be necessary to include projected population figures for the Hope VI redevelopments and Parramore Village. This will be determined and included in the data.

**Recommendations for Social Services/Educational Subcommittee**

1. Develop a database from the U S 2000 Census Data and social service eligibility requirements to identify the number of Parramore area residents who are eligible for social services. Using the criteria gained from the database/demographics, conduct focus groups with surveys to ascertain which social services the residents are receiving or require.
2. Conduct a multi-lingual public awareness and education campaign to inform Parramore area residents of available social services, including eligibility criteria for each social service. In addition, the campaign would educate residents on how to access information to meet their specific social service need.

3. Create a multi-lingual resource center for a “one stop shop” approach for Parramore residents in need of social services. This center would provide information and referral on all agencies and would utilize the 2-1-1 system.
  
4. Provide transportation necessary for children attending elementary schools outside of the Parramore neighborhood to attend afterschool programs at their schools.

The suggested recommendations will be e-mailed to task team #1 members for approval prior to the Social Service/Educational Subcommittee meeting on February 25.
