Increase safe, sanitary and affordable owner-occupied housing in the Parramore neighborhood

The Project

Parramore Kidz Zone

Provide scholarships for programs and services that Parramore children can't afford, such as summer camps, participation in sports teams, tutoring, college, and uncovered medical expenses.

Establish a childcare subsidy pool for children of Parramore's low-income working families.

Develop a prototype youth program, including job preparation, career counseling, community service activities, neighborhood art projects, youth ropes courses, motivational speakers, multi-media training, and field trips for Parramore teenagers.

Engage in a grassroots marketing campaign, including deploying an outreach team to the neighborhood, to link Parramore children and families to these positive opportunities.

Hire a university or non-profit research organization, to evaluate the effectiveness of the initiative.
