2. **CONSENT AGENDA**

a) **1601 Delaney Street; #HPB2001-00084 (District 1) ****

Request to construct new two-story house and detached one-story garage.

Recommended Action: Recommend approval to City Council.

b) **410 North Shine Avenue; #HPB2001-00081 (District 4) ****

Request to construct one-story addition to existing house.

Recommended Action: Recommend approval to City Council.

c) **615 East Harwood Street; #HPB2001-00082 (District 4) ****

Request to construct porte-cochere and a two-story addition. Also, request to construct wood picket fence, remove aluminum siding and alter the front porch.

Recommended Action: Recommend approval to City Council.

Request to renovate the structure.

b) **635 Cherokee Circle; #HPB2001-00079 (District 1) ****

c) **709 Euclid Avenue; #HPB2001-00087 (District 1) ****

Request to relocate existing house to the north side of the property. Also, request to construct new single-family, two-story house and pool on the south side of the property.

5. ADJOURNMENT

Items identified with (**) stars are quasi-judicial matters and persons dissatisfied with a Board recommendation in such matters may be entitled to a de novo hearing before an independent Hearing Officer. A request for a hearing with respect to a (**) starred item must be filed with the Historic Preservation Recording Secretary, 1st Floor, City Hall, by **5:00 PM Wednesday, MAY 9, 2001**. There is a \$250 fee for this de novo hearing. Any person who desires to appeal any recommendation at this meeting would need a record of the proceedings and for this purpose may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made which includes the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is made. Quasi-Judicial is defined as a policy implementing action; to be conducted subject to the Florida Supreme Court ruling in *Board of County Commissioners of Brevard County v. Snyder*. The Board's recommendation must be supported by "competent substantial evidence."

Persons with disabilities needing assistance to participate in any of these proceedings should contact the HPB Recording Secretary 24 hours in advance of the meeting.
