On February 05, 2007 at approximately 0350 hours, Officer Wendell Reeve and Officer Tim Ryan responded to the Blue Satellite Parking Lot at the Orlando International Airport (5501 Cargo Rd.). Upon their arrival, Officer Ryan met with the victim, Colleen Shipman. Ms. Shipman provided a description of the suspect as a dark haired, white female wearing glasses and a light colored trench coat with the hood pulled over her head. As Officer Ryan provided the suspect description over the radio, Officer Reeve was conducting an area check in the Blue Lot for the suspect.

As Officer Reeve approached the bus stop for section "C" in the Blue Lot, Officer Reeve observed a woman, fitting the description of the suspect, who was later identified as Mrs. Nowak. Officer Reeve watched as Mrs. Nowak walked into the bus stop, placed a black object, along with a white plastic bag into the trash can, and then walked away from the trash can. Officer Reeve stopped Mrs. Nowak and asked her if she could produce identification. While Mrs. Nowak was searching through her bag, Officer Ryan brought Ms. Shipman to bus stop "C", where Ms. Shipman positively identified Mrs. Nowak as the person who had attacked her. Ms. Shipman then stated that when the attack occurred, Mrs. Nowak had black hair and was wearing a different coat than what she had on at this time. Officer Reeve placed Mrs. Nowak under arrest for Battery.

Pursuant to arrest, Officer Reeve searched the black bag, which Mrs. Nowak possessed, and found inside a tan colored trench coat with a hood attached. From inside the trash can, Officer Reeve recovered the black object, which turned out to be a wig, and the plastic bag, which contained a CO-2 powered BB pistol.

On 02-05-07 at approximately 0445 hours, I, Detective Becton (11262), was notified of this incident. Upon my arrival at the Orlando Police Department Airport Division Office, I met with Ms. Shipman. She stated that she arrived at Orlando International Airport on United Airlines at approximately 0105 hours on 02-05-07, however, her luggage was not due to arrive until approximately 0300 hours. When Ms. Shipman took possession of her luggage, she walked out to the commercial vehicle lane and waited for the Airport Satellite Parking Lot bus to pick her up. While Ms. Shipman was waiting for the bus, she observed a woman wearing a tan trench coat (Mrs. Nowak) sitting on the bench near the taxi stand. When the bus arrived, Ms. Shipman boarded the bus. Ms. Shipman also observed Mrs. Nowak board the bus. The bus drove to the Blue Satellite Parking Lot, where Ms. Shipman exited the bus and started to walk towards her vehicle. Ms. Shipman noticed that Mrs. Nowak also exited the bus and was following her.

Because Ms. Shipman feared for her safety, she quickly entered her vehicle. Ms. Shipman stated that she could hear "running footsteps" coming towards her, as she was getting into her car. As Ms. Shipman closed and locked her car door, Mrs. Nowak slapped at the window of Ms. Shipman's car with her (Mrs. Nowak's) hands and tried to open the car door. Mrs. Nowak then said to Ms. Shipman, "Can you help me, please. My boyfriend was supposed to pick me up and he is not here. I've been traveling and it's late. Can you give me a ride to the parking office?" Ms. Shipman told Mrs. Nowak, "No. If you need help, I'll send someone to help you." Mrs. Nowak then asked if she could use Ms. Shipman's cell phone. Ms. Shipman responded, "No, the battery is dead." Mrs. Nowak indicated that she could not hear Ms. Shipman and started to cry. Ms. Shipman rolled her window down about 2 inches, so Mrs. Nowak could hear her. After Ms. Shipman rolled down her window, Mrs. Nowak sprayed some type of chemical spray into the vehicle, at Ms. Shipman's face. Ms. Shipman then drove away from Mrs. Nowak. Ms. Shipman stated that the spray made her eyes burn, and she drove to the manned toll booth at the parking lot exit, where the police were summoned.

I interviewed Mrs. Nowak, who made the following post Miranda taped statement:

Mrs. Nowak was involved in a relationship with Mr. Bill Oefelein. The relationship was categorized as more than a working relationship, but less than a romantic relationship. Mrs. Nowak discovered that Mr. Oefelein was also involved with Ms. Shipman. When Mrs. Nowak discovered that Ms. Shipman was flying from Houston, Texas to Orlando, Florida, Mrs. Nowak started planning her trip to Orlando in order to meet Ms. Shipman. Mrs. Nowak stated that she planned on talking with Ms. Shipman and discussing their relationship with Mr. Oefelein. Mrs. Nowak admitted to waiting for Ms. Shipman at the Orlando International Airport, following Ms. Shipman to her vehicle, asking Ms. Shipman to speak with her and spraying pepper spray into Ms. Shipman's car. Mrs. Nowak stated that this was the only time she was going to be able to speak with Ms. Shipman. When I asked Mrs. Nowak if she thought the pepper spray was going to help her speak with Ms. Shipman, she replied, "that was stupid." Mrs. Nowak stated that she was not trying to cause any bodily harm to Ms. Shipman and that she only wanted to scare Ms. Shipman into talking with her. I asked Mrs. Nowak about the new steel mallet, and the BB Gun. Mrs. Nowak stated that the BB gun was going to be used to entice Ms. Shipman to talk with her. Mrs. Nowak did not give any explanation for the black gloves or the trash bags. She did admit to wearing a disguise (wig and trench coat) only so that Ms. Shipman would allow Mrs. Nowak to speak with her. Mrs. Nowak provided permission to search her vehicle, which was parked at the LaQuinta Inn, off airport property. Inside the vehicle was an opened package for pepper spray, an unused CO-2 cartridge for a BB Gun, approximately 6 latex gloves, Map Quest directions from Houston, Texas to the Orlando International Airport, emails from Ms. Shipman to Mr. Oefelein, diapers that Mrs. Nowak admitted to using so she did not have to stop and urinate, a letter that indicated how much Mrs. Nowak loved Mr. Oefelein, an opened package for a buck knife, Ms. Shipman's home address, and hand written directions to Ms. Shipman's house. Receipts found in Mrs. Nowak's bag also indicate that she paid only cash in her travels from Houston to Orlando, including a stay at a hotel.

Also found inside the black bag, in Mrs. Nowak's possession at the time of arrest, were a brand new steel mallet, a brand new folding knife with a 4 inch blade, 3 - 4 feet of rubber tubing, several large plastic garbage bags, and approximately \$600 in cash. A hand written list with these items on it was also found inside the black bag.

Mrs. Nowak was placed under arrest for Attempted Kidnapping, Attempted Burglary to a Conveyance with a Battery Therein, Destruction of Evidence, and Battery.

Due to the detailed planning, which Mrs. Nowak made in her efforts to contact the Ms. Shipman, and the amount of weapons, disguises and other evidence that Mrs. Nowak had on her person and inside her vehicle, I have a well-founded fear for the safety of the victim. With the approval of Sgt. Ahern, it is recommended that the defendant be placed in a No Bond status.
